## **Course Selections by Major Guide**

## -- READ CAREFULLY--

The purpose of this guide is to provide you with the courses and number of credits that are already prescheduled for your major and to help you determine how many more credits are needed to complete your fall schedule request. Students that are listed as fully scheduled do not participate in the online survey, unless otherwise noted.

- Review your major's pre-scheduled course selections and credits that are listed below.
- Compare the courses to the requirements listed on the GCC Major Status Sheet.
- To complete your schedule request, look for courses in your major, general education and general electives. Review the Freshmen Course Offerings document for a list of what you may choose from at this time.
- 15-17 hours is a standard schedule. You must have a minimum of 12 credit hours to be a full-time student. You are permitted a maximum of 18 credit hours for the fall semester. The 18<sup>th</sup> credit will be assessed an additional charge.
- Use the New Student Guides link for more resource information on completing your course survey requests.
- All students are pre-scheduled for either Huma 102 \* or Writ 101 (3 credits).
  - \* Students may request Reli 211. See the "General Education Course Selection Info" link for more information.
- All students will also be pre-scheduled for Phye 100 (fall or spring) (1 credit) for either the fall or spring semester.

## **Major Course Selections**

<u>Accounting</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Acct 201; Mngt 103 or Mark 104; and Econ 101 or Econ 102. Accounting majors typically fill the remaining 3-4 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education, general elective, or a major-required course.

<u>Biblical & Religious Studies</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Reli 211. Biblical Studies majors will need to choose one major elective course for 3 credits and will then fill the remaining part of their schedule with a language (if needed) and a mixture of general education and/or general elective credits.

<u>Biochemistry</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); Biol 101 with lab; Chem 111; CHEM 113; and Math 161.

<u>Biology</u> (non-education) majors are pre-scheduled for Biol 101 with lab; Chem 111; and Chem 113. Biology majors may also take Math 111-Precalculus, Math 161-Calculus I, a Foundations, or general elective course.

<u>Biology</u> (including secondary education) majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); Biol 101 with lab; Chem 111; Chem 113; and Educ 202 or Psyc 102.

<u>Business Analysis</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Comp 141; Mngt 103; and Econ 101 or Econ 102. Business Analysis majors typically fill the remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education or general elective course.

<u>Business Economics</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Acct 201; Mngt 103 or Mark 104; and Econ 101 or Econ 102. Business Economics majors typically fill the remaining 5-6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed), general education, general elective courses, or a major-required course.

<u>Business Statistics</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Comp 141; Mngt 103; and Mngt 201. Business Statistics majors typically fill the remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education or general elective course.

<u>Chemistry</u> (including secondary education) majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100; Chem 111; Chem 113; Phys 121 with lab; and Math 161. **Note:** You may take Phys 101: General Physics with lab instead of College Physics. If there is a preference for taking General Physics, please contact the Registrar's Office.

<u>Christian Ministries</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Reli 211. Christian Ministry majors will need to choose one major elective course for 3 credits and will then fill the remaining part of their schedule with a language (if needed) and a mixture of general education and/or general elective credits.

<u>Communication Arts</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Comm 104 and Comm 135. Communication Arts majors typically fill the remaining 5-7 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education, general elective courses.

<u>Computer Science (Bach. of Arts)</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Comp 141; Comp 155; and a lab science. Computer Science (B. A.) majors will need to fill the remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education, general elective courses.

<u>Computer Science (Bach. of Science)</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Comp 141; Comp 155; Math 161; and a lab science. Phye 100 will be registered for the spring.

<u>Data Science</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100; Comp 141; Math 161; and a lab science.

<u>Design & Innovation</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Desi 101; Entr 101; and Entr 104. Design & Innovation majors typically fill the remaining 5-6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education and general elective courses.

<u>Economics</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Econ 101 or Econ 102; Econ 120; and Phil 161. Economics majors typically fill the remaining 3-4 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education and general elective courses. **Tip:** Mngt 201 or Math 141 are possible major-related choices.

<u>Electrical Engineering</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Mece 120; Engr 156; Math 161; and Chem 105 with lab.

<u>Elementary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Educ 204; Educ 202 or Psyc 102; and Educ 281 (fall or spring). Elementary Education majors typically fill the remaining 5-6 credits of their schedule with Math 151, a language (if needed), or another major-required course.

<u>English</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Engl 201 and one additional 3 credit English course. English majors typically fill remaining 6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education, general elective courses.

<u>English Communication Secondary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Engl 201; Comm 104; and Educ 202 or Psyc 102. English Communication Secondary Education majors typically fill remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education course.

<u>English Secondary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Engl 201; one additional 3 credit English course; and Educ 202 or Psyc 102. English Secondary Education majors typically fill remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education course.

<u>Entrepreneurship</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Entr 101; Entr 102; and Mark 104. Entrepreneur majors typically fill the remaining 4-6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education, general elective courses.

<u>Exercise Science</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Biol 101 with lab and Exer 101 in either the fall or spring semester. Exercise Science majors typically fill the remaining credits with Chemistry 111 and 113, general education, and/or general elective courses.

<u>Finance</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule includes Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); Acct 201; Mngt 103 or Mark 104; Mngt 110; and Econ 101 or 102.

<u>French</u> majors are pre-scheduled only for Huma 102 or Writ 101; and Phye 100 (fall or spring). French majors should review the French guidelines on the New Student Guides webpage, determine the level of their French experience, and note the appropriate course(s). You are encouraged to contact the French resource professor as noted on the French Guide. French majors typically fill remaining 12-13 credits of their schedule with major-required courses and general education or general elective courses.

<u>French Secondary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); and Educ 202 or Psyc 102. French Secondary Education majors should review the French guidelines on the New Student Guides webpage, determine the level of their French experience, and note the appropriate course(s). You are encouraged to contact the French resource professor as noted on the French Guide. French majors typically fill remaining 8-10 credits of their schedule with major-required courses and general education or general elective courses.

<u>History</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Hist 143. History majors typically fill the remaining 8-10 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) and general education or general elective courses.

<u>History Secondary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Hist 143, Educ 202, and Psyc 102. History Secondary Education majors typically fill the remaining 3-4 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) and general education or general elective courses.

<u>Human Resource Management</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Mark 104; Math 141 or 161; and Econ 101 or 102. Human Resource Management majors typically fill the remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education or general elective course.

<u>International Business</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Mngt 103 or Mark 104; Econ 101 or 102; and Math 141 or 161. A language is required as part of the fall schedule and this can be selected and submitted on the scheduling survey.

<u>Management</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Mngt 103 or Mark 104; Mngt 211; and Econ 101 or Econ 102. Management majors typically fill the remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or a general education or general elective course.

<u>Marketing</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Mark 104; Math 141; and Econ 101 or 102. Marketing majors typically fill the remaining 3 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) and general education or general elective courses.

<u>Mathematics</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Comp 141; and Math 161, Math 162, or Math 261. (Calc II or III are dependent on AP/CLEP or transfer course credit received). Mathematics majors typically fill the remaining 5-6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) and major-required, general education or general elective courses.

<u>Mathematics Secondary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Educ 202 or Psyc 102; and Math 161, Math 162, or Math 261. (Calc II or III are dependent on AP/CLEP or transfer course credit received). Mathematics Secondary Education majors typically fill the remaining 5-6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) and major-required, general education or general elective courses.

<u>Mechanical Engineering</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100; Math 161; Chem 105 with lab; Mece 107; and Mece 109.

<u>Middle Level Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Educ 204; Educ 202 or Psyc 102; and Math 151 or Hist 253. Mid-level majors typically fill the remaining 3-4 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed), or a major-required course.

<u>Music and Music Performance</u> majors do not participate in the online survey. The pre-scheduled courses include Musi 103; Musi 105; and Musi 199. Schedules will be completed with assistance from the music faculty during the Freshman Preview Sessions or by contacting the Music Department after July 1.

<u>Music Business</u> majors do not participate in the online survey. The pre-scheduled courses include Econ 101; Musi 103; Musi 105; and Musi 199. Schedules will be completed with assistance from the music faculty during the Freshman Preview Sessions or by contacting the Music Department after July 1.

<u>Music Education</u> majors do not participate in the online survey. The pre-scheduled courses include Educ 202 or Psyc 102; Musi 103; Musi 105; Musi 108; Musi 221; and Musi 199. Schedules will be completed with assistance from the music faculty during the Freshman Preview Sessions or by contacting the Music Department after July 1.

<u>Music Religion</u> majors do not participate in the online survey. The pre-scheduled courses include Reli 211; Musi 103; Musi 105; and Musi 199. Schedules will be completed with assistance from the music faculty during the Freshman Preview Sessions or by contacting the Music Department after July 1.

<u>Nursing</u> majors are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102; Writ 101; Phye 100; Psyc 101; Comm 104; and Exer 253 with lab.

<u>Philosophy</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Phil 191. Philosophy majors typically fill the remaining 9 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education and general elective courses.

<u>Physics (non-education)</u> are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); Math 161; Phys 101 with lab; Phys 135; and COMP 141.

<u>Physics (secondary education)</u> are fully scheduled and do not participate in the online survey. The schedule will include Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); Math 161; Phys 101 with lab; Phys 135; and Psyc 102.

<u>Political Science</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Pols 104 and 204. Political Science majors typically fill the remaining 6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed) or general education and general elective courses. Pols 101 will be scheduled for the spring semester.

<u>Psychology (BA & BS)</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Psyc 101. Psychology majors typically fill the remaining 9 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed), general education, or general elective courses. Bachelor of Arts majors may request Scic 202 with lab or Biol 101 with lab in their freshman year. Bachelor of Science majors may request Biol 101 with lab in their freshman year.

<u>Social Work</u> majors pre-scheduled for Socw 101. Social Work majors typically fill the remaining 9 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed), general education or general elective courses.

<u>Sociology</u> majors pre-scheduled for Soci 101 and another 3-credit sociology course. Sociology majors typically fill the remaining 6 credits of their schedule with a language (if needed), general education or general elective courses.

<u>Spanish</u> majors are pre-scheduled only for Huma 102 or Writ 101; and Phye 100 (fall or spring). Spanish majors should review the Spanish guidelines on the New Student Guides webpage, complete the Modern Language Department placement exam, and note the appropriate course(s). You are encouraged to contact the Spanish resource professor as noted on the Spanish Guide. Spanish majors typically fill remaining 12-13 credits of their schedule with major-required courses and general education or general elective courses.

Spanish Secondary Education majors are pre-scheduled for Huma 102 or Writ 101; Phye 100 (fall or spring); and Educ 202 or Psyc 102. Spanish Secondary Education majors should review the Spanish guidelines on the New Student Guides webpage, complete the Modern Language Department placement exam, and note the appropriate course(s). You are encouraged to contact the Spanish resource professor as noted on the Spanish Guide. Spanish Sec. Ed. majors typically fill remaining 9 credits of their schedule with a foundations course, major-required courses, or general education or general elective courses.

<u>Special Education with Elementary Education</u> majors are pre-scheduled for Educ 202; Psyc 102; and Math 151. Special Education majors typically fill the remaining 3-4 credits of their schedule with Educ 281, a language (if needed), or a major-required course.

<u>Undeclared</u> (Liberal Arts/Science Engineering) majors are pre-scheduled for 4 credits including Huma 102 or Writ 101, and PHYE 100 (FALL OR SPRING). Undeclared majors typically request course(s) that are "test-drives" for a possible future major. Additional courses may include general education courses like a Foundations course and as space is available either a SCIC-science course (for liberal arts undecided majors) or a general science course (for science engineering undecided majors). Review the other GCC Major Status Sheets found at the New Student link. You may see a potential major with courses that are of interest to you. If you wish to declare a major, contact the Admissions Office.
