ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

French 101-102 does not count toward fulfillment of the major. The French major requires 30 credit hours beyond the elementary level. A student with prior experience in French should begin at a more advanced level determined by the criteria in the College Catalog (under Modern Languages).

The achievement level at which you should enter the modern language of your choice will depend upon your experience with that language.

- 1. If you have studied the language in high school for less than two years, we recommend the beginning course.
- 2. If you have studied the language for two years with grades of "B" or better, we recommend the intermediate course.
- 3. If you have studied the language for three years with grades of "B" or better, we recommend an intermediate or advanced course to be selected with the help of your advisor.
- I. If you have studied the language for four years in high school with grades of "A," we recommend an advanced course to be selected with the help of your faculty advisor.
- 5. If it becomes apparent that a student in his/her first term of study of a language at Grove City College has been placed in a class that is inappropriate for his/her abilities, he/she may be placed back or advanced one level at the option of the Department. This may be done no later than one week after mid-term grades are due.
