## GENERAL INFORMATION

Spanish 101-102 and 201-202 do not count toward fulfillment of the major. A student with prior experience in Spanish should begin at a more advanced level determined by the criteria in the College Catalog (under Modern Languages).

The achievement level at which you should enter the modern language of your choice will depend upon your experience with that language.

1. If you have studied the language in high school for less than two years, we recommend the beginning course.
2. If you have studied the language for two years with grades of " B " or better, we recommend the intermediate course.
3. If you have studied Spanish for three or four years with grades of "B" or better, we recommend the course Spanish Language and Culture (SPAN 295).
4. If you have studied the language for five or more years in high school with grades of "A," we recommend SPAN 295 or an advanced course to be selected with the help of your faculty advisor.
5. If it becomes apparent that a student in his/her first term of study of a language at Grove City College has been placed in a class that is inappropriate for his/her abilities, he/she may be placed back or advanced one level at the option of the Department. This may be done no later than one week after mid-term grades are due.
