***COLLEGE FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS.....**

Grove City College requires all B.A. graduates and non-science B.S. graduates to demonstrate a "second year" proficiency in foreign language. The standard for determining the language course needs for each student is based on the following:

- 1) Students who have studied three years of the **same** foreign language in high school with a "B" average or better will be exempt from further language study.
- 2) Students who have studied two years of the **same** foreign language in high school with a "B" average or better will normally begin college language study at the second year level. Upon completion of that year, the student will have met the language requirement.
- 3) Students who score an acceptable level on one of the Advanced Placement foreign language achievement tests will receive college credit and may be eligible to complete the requirement by taking the second year language courses.
- 4) Foreign languages offered at Grove City College include Chinese, French, and Spanish.

Grove City College believes that these requirements help promote a high level of cultural literacy and communication skills that are necessary in order for students to be competitive in our emerging global economy.
