1. JUNIOR YEAR or SEMESTER ABROAD requires alternate planning, which must be done well in advance.

 3. Student teaching may be either in the first or second semester; when possible, make either semester of senior year available for student teaching. EDUC 305 and 307 should be taken in the same semester and must be taken before student teaching.

Essential information: French 101-102 do not count toward fulfillment of the major. The French major with K-12 certification requires 32 credit hours of French beyond the elementary level. A student with prior experience in French should begin at a more advanced level as determined by the placement exam and in consultation with Modern Language faculty.
