Essential information: Spanish 101-102 and 201-202 do not count toward fulfillment of the major. The Spanish major with K-12 certification requires 35 credit hours of Spanish beyond the intermediate level. A student with prior experience in Spanish should begin at a more advanced level as determined by the placement exam and in consultation with Modern Language faculty.
