BUSINESS CONCENTRATION (choose one area)----- 12 HOURS

Accounting: ACCT 301, 303, 321; and one additional 300-400 level ACCT course.
Economics: ECON 301, 302; and two additional ECON courses (ECON 202, 206, and 303 cannot be used to fulfill both the concentration and International Business Core requirements).
Entrepreneurship: ENTR 312, 430, 466; and one course from ENTR 309, 318, or 423.
Finance: FNCE 332, 440; and two courses from FNCE 334, 341, 435, or 436.
Management: MNGT 457; and three courses from MNGT 302, 304, 307, 311, 433, 450, 458, or 475.
Marketing: MARK 411, 419; and two courses from INBS 416, 417, MARK 315, 316, 412, 415, 417, 420, or MNGT 424. (INBS 416 and 417 cannot be used to fulfill both the Marketing concentration and International Business Core requirements.)

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INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS CORE----- 9 HOURS

Choose three courses from the following: INBS 408, 416, 417, 445 (required for management and marketing concentrations), ECON 202, ECON 206, ECON 303, ENTR 307, ENTR 312*, or FNCE 462 (required for finance and accounting concentrations). With advance Department Chair approval, ACCT, ENTR, FNCE, INBS, MARK, or MNGT 390 may count toward this requirement. *Note: Students completing the Entrepreneurship Concentration may not count ENTR 312 toward the International Business Core.

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GLOBAL EMPHASIS ELECTIVES----- 6 HOURS

Two courses from COMM 225; any GOBL course; or any non-United States History or Political Science course.
