Saturday's game is Senior Day for Grove City's 13 seniors, who are playing their final game at Thorn Field.

It is also Grove City's only 1:00 kickoff in the 2009 season.

### SENIOR DAY SUCCESS

Grove City is 9-1 in its last 10 Senior Day games at Thorn Field. The lone loss came in 2004, when Westminster pulled out a 9-6 win in the season finale.

Prior to 2004, Grove City last played Westminster in the home finale in 1949, when the Wolverines won 33-20.

The teams first met in 1892.

**LAST MEETING**

Grove City quarterback Andrew DiDonato set a new single-game school record with 363 yards of total offense but host Westminster pulled out a 24-21 win over the Wolverines at Memorial Field November 8, 2008.

Westminster took its 24-21 lead with 46 seconds left but Grove City answered by driving 56 yards to the Westminster 1.

Grove City went for the win but Westminster stopped DiDonato's quarterback sneak inches short of the goal line on the final play of the game.

Tailback Blaine Miller ran for 77 yards and two scores for Grove City. Grove City amassed a season-high 454 yards of offense, along with 31 first downs.

Linebacker Adam Eichler forced a fumble and intercepted a pass for Grove City.

The Wolverines owned a nine-minute advantage in time of possession and went 8 for 14 on third down.

However, Grove City misfired on four of seven scoring chances inside the 20-yard line. The Wolverines executed 85 plays.

**LAST GAME**

Grove City evened its Presidents' Athletic Conference record last Saturday with a 35-24 home win over Waynesburg at Robert E. Thorn Field.

Tailback Blaine Miller ran for 108 yards and two touchdowns while quarterback Andrew DiDonato also ran for two scores. DiDonato's second touchdown -- a 23-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter -- gave Grove City a 35-17 lead after Waynesburg had rallied.

Grove City's special teams also scored a touchdown in the win as James Jennings fell on a fumbled punt attempt in the end zone.

The Wolverines forced four turnovers in the win. Butch Kriger forced the fumbled punt attempt and also recovered a fumble. Jason Ferguson set up a touchdown with a 21-yard fumble return while Aaron Palmieri intercepted a pass.

Nose tackle Marcus Chakot had two sacks, four tackles for loss and a forced fumble. Ferguson recorded a team-high 10 tackles for Grove City.

It is Grove City's second straight win over Waynesburg.

## FAMILY TRADITION

Several members of the 2009 Grove City College football team have ties to other current or former Grove City student-athletes.

Senior quarterback Andrew DiDonato is the younger brother of former Grove City wide receiver Dave DiDonato. Dave DiDonato played split end at Grove City from 2001-2004 and caught a school-record 10 touchdowns in 2003.

Sophomore cornerback Mark Rossol is the younger brother of former volleyball standout Emily Rossol, who earned four letters from 2003-06 at Grove City.

Senior wide receiver Adam Chakot is the older brother of sophomore center Lucas Chakot and sophomore defensive end Marcus Chakot.

Sophomore defensive end Zack Patterson is the younger brother for former Wolverine defensive end Mike Patterson (2001-04).

Freshman safety Shawn Mercer is the younger brother of former wide receiver Stephen Mercer (2005-08). Stephen Mercer earned the team's Most Valuable Player award in 2008.

Sophomore wide receiver Will McCoy is the younger brother of current Grove City basketball player Joe McCoy, who will be a fifth-year senior this winter for the Wolverines.

Also, wide receivers coach Dave Lacinski is the brother of former Grove City quarterback Steve Lacinski, who started 34 games from 1997-2000.

## PRIDE AND POISE

Grove City has been the least-penalized team in the Presidents' Athletic Conference in each of the last four seasons.

Currently, the Wolverines have committed just 43 penalties through eight games this year. That figure ranks second in the PAC.

Grove City is averaging 44.6 yards per game in penalties, second-lowest in the conference.

The Wolverines have not exceeded the 100-yard mark in penalties in one game since Sept. 6, 2003 -- a span of 67 games. In a 68-20 win over Hiram that day, the Wolverines had 13 penalties for 103 yards.

## TRADING PLACES

Three Grove City players switched from offense to defense prior to the 2009 season. Junior guard Jes Schnatterly moved to defensive end while sophomore wide receiver Aaron Palmieri switched to cornerback. Sophomore Vince Angelo is at outside linebacker after finishing 2008 at wingback.

## MAKING THEIR POINT

Under head coach Chris Smith, Grove City has eclipsed the 30-point mark 45 times. The Wolverines are 42-3 in those 45 games. The first defeat in those 44 games came Nov. 7, 1998 at Muhlenberg as Grove City fell in overtime, 34-31.

Each of the last two setbacks has come this season, however. Grove City earned a 41-20 win over Saint Vincent last week to earn win No. 42.

All-time, Grove City is 122-5-1 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Prior to this season, Grove City's last loss in regulation when scoring more than 30 points came in a 35-31 loss to Frostburg State in 1982.

## SPECIAL FORCES

Grove City's special teams units feature several veterans who have plenty of experience in the kicking game.

Junior Craig Bicehouse will handle the kicking duties after earning All-Presidents' Athletic Conference Honorable Mention in 2008.

Sophomore Ed Reith will punt after averaging 36.6 yards per kick last year. He earned All-PAC Second Team recognition.

Freshman Kyle Meckley snaps for extra points and field goals while A.J. Tapper is in his third year as punt snapper.

Senior tight end Chris Rich will hold for extra points and field goals, continuing the Grove City tradition of having a receiver hold for place-kicks.

Rich follows in the footsteps of split ends Jake Dailey (1997-2000), Todd Gibson (2001), Dave DiDonato (2003-04), Matt Kulinski (2005-06) and Stephen Mercer (2007-08). Quarterback Todd Smargiasso held in 2002.

Reith and freshman Shane Kaclik will return kick-offs while junior Butch Kriger and rookie Kyle Sattler will field punts.

## DOUBLE VISION

For the first time in recent memory, the Grove City College football team features multiple players wearing the same number.

Sophomore quarterback Zach Gross and freshman punter Matt Novotny are both wearing jersey No. 12 this season.

## TURNING TWO

Grove City is 1 for 2 on two-point conversions this year. The successful attempt came in the fourth quarter of Grove City's 35-14 win at Bethany as Luke O'Hara pulled in a pass from Andrew DiDonato.

The Wolverines have not rushed for a two-point conversion since October 1, 2005, when Seth Fox scored in a 21-12 win over Bethany. Grove City's last unsuccessful two-point run came November 8, 2003 when Kings Point stopped Brandon McGlothlin. The Wolverines won that game 29-14.

## NOT WORKING OVERTIME

Grove City has not played an overtime game since Sept. 14, 2002. That day, the Wolverines dropped a 9-6 decision to visiting Carnegie Mellon.

Grove City's 76-game span without an overtime is the longest stretch in program history since overtime's introduction in 1996.

From 1978 to 1988, Grove City went 94 games without a tie, which is the longest period in program history without a game being tied at the end of regulation. The Wolverines are 3-4 all-time in OT.

## GRADE A ANDREW

Grove City senior quarterback Andrew DiDonato is the program's all-time leading passer with 6,865 career yards. He set a new single-season school record with 1,923 yards in 2008.

DiDonato is also Grove City's all-time leader with 45 career touchdown passes.

At Carnegie Mellon September 12, DiDonato set single-game Grove City records with 382 passing yards and five touchdown passes. His 473 yards of total offense that day are also a school record.

DiDonato set a new single-game Grove City record with 32 pass completions against Dickinson.

## MORE RECORDS

Senior Andrew DiDonato is Grove City's all-time career leader in total offense with 8,130 yards. R.J. Bowers held the previous Grove City record in that category with 7,353 yards. Bowers ran for that total during his career 1997-2000.

In 2008, DiDonato set a single-season record with 2,310 yards of total offense. He has 2,220 yards through eight games this season.

## DOUBLE DUTY

Nine Grove City players also participated in a spring sport during the 2008-09 academic year.

Five Wolverines helped the Grove City men's track and field team earn its fifth consecutive Presidents' Athletic Conference title last spring.

Senior Tony Clark took third in the discus at the 2009 PAC Championships while junior Pete Polesnak finished third in the javelin.

Senior Mike Zorch finished 17th in the javelin while sophomore George Matthews V took 11th in the shot put and 13th in the javelin.

Sophomore Zach Gross placed 10th in the javelin. Gross won the javelin title at the Marietta Invitational April 4 while Matthews took second in the javelin that day.

Four football players also saw action for the Grove City baseball team last season. Junior Butch Kriger started in left field and hit .276 while starting all 37 games. Kriger led the team with four triples and finished second on the squad with 14 extra-base hits.

He hit .388 as a freshman outfielder/DH in 2008. Kriger ranked third on the squad in batting average and on-base percentage (.471) while helping the Wolverines earn their first-ever invitation to the NCAA Championship Tournament.

Current sophomore Marcus Chakot went 6 for 10 with two doubles as a reserve catcher last year. Classmate Jason Ferguson played in six games as a first baseman while sophomore Will McCoy started eight games at catcher.

## WORLDWIDE WOLVERINES

The Grove City College roster features players from 11 different states this season.

Pennsylvania leads the way with 54 Keystone State products on the roster. Twenty-four current Wolverines are from Ohio while New Jersey has produced four current Grove City players.

There are two Maryland products on the Grove City roster in 2009.

Grove City also has one player each from Colorado, Florida, Indiana, Michigan, New Hampshire, New York and Oregon.

In recent years, Grove City has also had players from Alaska, Arizona, North Carolina, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin.

## AMONG THE PAC LEADERS

Several Grove City players are among the statistical leaders in the Presidents' Athletic Conference after Week Eight of the 2009 season.

Quarterback Andrew DiDonato leads the PAC in total offensive yards (2,220), completions (188), and attempts (294).

Linebacker Jason Ferguson has a conference-high 83 total tackles this year.

Team-wise, Grove City leads the conference in third-down conversions as the Wolverines are 46 of 102 (45.1 percent). The Wolverines are also tops in the PAC in red zone efficiency, scoring on 28 of 31 (90.3 percent) trips inside the 20-yard line.

Grove City's 177 first downs are also tops in the league. Defensively, Grove City leads the conference with five takeaways in the red zone.

## GETTING EVERYONE INVOLVED

Three different Grove City players have thrown touchdown passes in 2009 as Andrew DiDonato (14), Clayton Hall (1) and Zach Summy (1) have all completing scoring passes.

It is the sixth time under head coach Chris Smith that three Wolverines have thrown a touchdown pass in a season. Grove City also accomplished the feat in 1984, 1986, 1987, 1989 and 1990.

The single-season record for most players throwing a touchdown pass is four, set in 1976. That year, Greg Maxcy (3), Mike Tappe (2), Steve Grejda (1) and Phil Yancheff (1) all completed touchdown passes.

This season, eight different Grove City players have caught touchdown passes, which is a new single-season program record. Will McCoy (4), Luke O'Hara (3), Summy (3), Blaine Miller (2), Hall (1), Anthony Reda (1), Ed Reith (1) and A.J. Tapper (1) are the eight players who touchdown catches in 2009.

## MAKING THEIR POINT

The 85 combined points in Grove City's September 12 game with Carnegie Mellon represents the eighth-highest combined point total in program history. Grove City's 87 points in the first two games represents the 13th-highest two-game total in program history.

It is also just the sixth time in program history that the Wolverines have surpassed the 40-point mark in consecutive games.

The Wolverines' 122-point output over the first three weeks represented the highest three-game sum for the program since the 1998 team scored 132 in consecutive wins over Bluffton (40-0), Bethany (37-20) and Thiel (55-0).

The record for points scored in a three-game stretch is 167, which carried over from the end of the 1911 season and into the 1912 season. Grove City closed 1911 with a 21-0 win over Hiram, then opened the next year with wins over Oil City (72-0) and Thiel (74-0).

The 1997 team set the four-game record by accumulating 204 points in consecutive wins over Waynesburg (42-30), Bluffton (71-21), Bethany (35-21) and Denison (41-29).
