THIS WEEK'S GAME

Grove City hosts Westminster Saturday afternoon in the annual Homecoming game at Robert E. Thorn Field.

It is the 95th all-time meeting between the teams, who first met in 1892.

Saturday's game marks the first time since 1983 that Grove City will host Westminster as its opponent for Homecoming.

THE CLOSER YOU GET

Seven of the last eight meetings between Grove City and Westminster have been decided by seven points or less. The game-winning touchdown in Grove City's wins in 2009 and 2012 came with 18 seconds or less. In 2008, Westminster stopped Grove City inside the 1 on the final play of the game.

Each team is 4-4 in the last eight meetings overall.

LAST MEETING

Junior quarterback Brian Pell fired a five-yard touchdown pass to junior wide receiver Anthony Ritchie with 18 seconds left, lifting Grove City to a 23-21 win at Westminster September 30, 2012 in Presidents' Athletic Conference action at Memorial Field.

Ritchie kept Grove City's game-winning drive alive on the preceding play as he ran for three yards on fourth-and-1 on an end around.

Earlier in the drive, Ritchie caught a seven-yard pass on fourth-and-5.

Pell gave Grove City a 7-0 lead with a five-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

He also threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Ritchie in the second quarter, putting the Wolverines ahead 14-7.

Kurt Devlin kicked a 35-yard field goal on the final play of the first half, pushing the Wolverines' lead to 17-7 at halftime.

Ryan Althausen recorded two of Grove City's four sacks and Joe Diani intercepted his third pass in the last two games. Jason Ferguson led the defense with a dozen tackles.

Grove City finished the game with 407 total offensive yards -- 207 on the ground and 200 passing yards.

LAST GAME

Grove City's furious second-half comeback fell just short last Saturday at Presidents' Athletic Conference foe Bethany as the host Bison pulled out a 34-31 win at Bison Stadium.

Grove City pulled to within 34-31 with 1:22 left when Brian Pell threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to Khalil Ervin.

The Wolverines then regained possession when sophomore linebacker Tyler Campbell snared Pat Donoughe's onside kick.

However, Bethany's Chanan Scott intercepted Pell to seal the win for the Bison.

Grove City owned a 431-393 edge in total offense. The Wolverines also punted just once in the game.

Each team had exactly 30 minutes of possession and 21 first downs.

Pell's 289 passing yards represented the ninth-highest single-game total in Grove City history.

Joe Diani intercepted a pass for the Wolverines while Ben Manwaring recorded 1.5 quarterback sacks.

DOUBLE YOUR FUN

Seven Grove City players also participated in a spring sport during the 2012-13 academic year.

Junior defensive end Reese Swatsworth played in five games as a first baseman for Grove City's baseball team last spring. He hit .250 (3 for 12) and made two starts.

Sophomore linebacker Kenny McCracken made 14 starts for the baseball team while primarily playing DH. He hit .327 and drove in 10 runs.

Sophomore tailback Steve Maskrey and sophomore quarterback Drew Chorey each appeared three games as a pitcher for the baseball team.

Sophomore linebacker Joe Siefert placed 13th in the discus at the 2013 Presidents' Athletic Conference Track and Field Championships. Junior guard Zach Kepple placed 19th in the shot put and 20th in the discus at the conference meet. Junior tackle Jason Glacken also competed as a thrower last year.

Four assistant football coaches at Grove City also have spring duties. Todd Gibson is entering his fourth year as Grove City's head men's and women's track and field coach while Rob Skaricich will begin his 17th year as head baseball coach.

Matt Gregg is an assistant track and field coach, working specifically with the throwers. Dr. Jim Chinn coaches the sprinters and relays for the track team.

PRIDE AND POISE

In 2012, Grove City led NCAA Division III in fewest penalty yards at just 34.3 yards per game. For the season, Grove City committed just 41 penalties, which led the Presidents' Athletic Conference.

This year, Grove City leads the conference in fewest penalties (19) and penalty yards per game (40.5).

Grove City also finished the 2011 season as the least-penalized team in the conference. The Wolverines committed just 38 penalties for 309 yards.

Grove City ranked third nationally in NCAA Division III in fewest penalty yards per game in 2011. The Wolverines' 38 infractions represented the fifth-lowest total in the nation that season.

Grove City finished the 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008 seasons as the conference's least-penalized program.

FAMILY TRADITION

Several members of the 2013 Grove City College football team have ties to other current or former Grove City student-athletes.

Senior wide receiver Mitch Narbe is the younger brother of former Grove City softball player Cassie Narbe (2007-08).

Senior defensive end Ryan Althausen is the older brother of Grove City sophomore volleyball player Stephanie Althausen and freshman volleyball player Jessica Althausen.

Junior linebacker Jason Skyrn is the younger brother of former Grove City linebacker Matt Skyrn (2007-10). Their cousin, Jamie Skyrn, earned two letters as an infielder for Grove City's baseball team in 2005 and 2006.

Freshman tailback Jeff Croll is the son of former Grove City wide receiver/punter Travis Croll (1986-89). Travis Croll earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors as a senior.

Freshman guard Mitch Zajicek is the younger brother of sophomore women's soccer player Madison Zajicek. Their mother, Monica (Yustak) Zajicek, played basketball at Grove City from 1984 to 1987 and is a 2012 Grove City College Athletic Hall of Fame inductee.

Outside linebackers coach Todd Gibson is the son of wide receivers coach John Gibson.

SPECIAL FORCES

Grove City's special teams units feature several veterans and a handful of newcomers at the start of the 2013 season.

Senior Patrick Donoughe is expected to handle kick-offs while freshmen Cole McCandless and Ryan Stewart will compete to handle extra points and field goals.

Senior safety Joe Diani has punted for the Wolverines in each of the last two seasons but freshman Anthony Marnejon could take over those duties this year.

Sophomore Nick Piett returns as punt snapper. Junior center Ron Dornin or freshman guard Mitch Zajicek will snap for extra points and field goals.

Sophomore quarterback Drew Chorey takes over as the holder.

Junior Sam Ivan and sophomore Gabriel Moore are expected to field kickoffs. Ivan and senior wide receiver Anthony Ritchie will return punts.

Assistant coach Matt Gregg is in his first season as special teams coordinator. Assistant coach Dr. Jim Chinn continues to work with the kickers and punters. He served as special teams coach from 2003 to 2012.

Four current Grove City players earned Capital One/College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) First Team Academic All-District honors in 2012.

Senior defensive backs Joe Diani and Chris Gibbs both earned Academic All-District for the second straight season.

Senior wide receiver Anthony Ritchie and junior wingback Sam Ivan each earned their first Academic All-District citation.

GIBBS GETTING IT DONE

In 2012, defensive back Chris Gibbs became the first junior football player at Grove City College to be named Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America. Gibbs earned Second Team Academic All-America.

He is the seventh Grove City player to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition.

LOOKING OUT FOR NUMBER TWO

When sophomore tailback Steve Maskrey ran for a two-point conversion September 28 at Bethany, it marked Grove City's first two-pointer on the ground in eight years.

Prior to Maskrey's score, Grove City last rushed for a two-point conversion on October 1, 2005, when Seth Fox scored in a 21-12 win over Bethany.

Grove City is believed to be the first NCAA team to win a game on a two-point conversion. The NCAA introduced the two-point conversion prior to the 1958 season and on September 27 of that year, Grove City scored a late touchdown against Washington & Jefferson, cutting the Presidents' margin to 14-13.

Head coach Jack Behringer went for the win and quarterback Ray "Junior" Thompson threw a successful pass to halfback Joe Maraffi for the game-winning points.

ZERO HOUR

Grove City's September 14 shutout of Anderson (Ind.) marked the Wolverines' first shutout since a 44-0 win over Saint Vincent in 2007.

Grove City had not blanked an opponent in its home facility since 1999, when the Wolverines rolled to a 56-0 win at Thiel. The Wolverines had not shut out a non-conference opponent on the road since closing the 1979 season with a 28-0 victory at W&J.

AMONG THE CONFERENCE LEADERS

Grove City leads the Presidents' Athletic Conference in third down conversions at 57.7 percent (30 for 52). The Wolverines are also a league-best 4 for 7 (57.1 percent) on fourth down.

Grove City is second in red zone offense, scoring on 84 percent (16 of 19) of its trips inside opponents' 20-yard line.

Defensively, the Wolverines are second in red zone defense as opponents have scored on just 11 of their 19 trips (57.9 percent) inside the 20.

The Wolverines lead the conference with 10 quarterback sacks. Grove City ranks second in pass offense efficiency with a team rating of 148.1.

Inside linebacker Ben Manwaring ranks fourth in the conference with 2.5 quarterback sacks. Outside linebacker Jason Skyrms is second in the league with six tackles for loss.

Strong safety Chris Gibbs shares the conference lead with two forced fumbles.

START ME UP

Five Grove City players made their first collegiate start September 7 against Carnegie Mellon: junior offensive tackle Jason Glacken, freshman offensive guard Mitch Zajicek, sophomore nose tackle Brent Veerman, sophomore defensive tackle Ryan Hickey and senior linebacker Brandon Miller.

Freshman cornerback Jimmy Cianciola and sophomore tailback Steve Maskrey both made their first collegiate start September 14 at Anderson.

Sophomore outside linebacker Tyler Campbell and junior cornerback Ryan Duran each made start No. 1 September 28 at Bethany.

PELL GRANT

Grove City senior quarterback Brian Pell earned Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Southwest Offensive Player of the Week honors in recognition of his performance at Bethany September 28.

Pell threw for 289 yards and three touchdowns on 23 of 29 passing.

Pell ranks second all time at Grove City with 4,298 career passing yards. He also ranks second with 395 pass completions and 676 pass attempts.

Pell's career completion percentage of 58.4 also ranks second in Grove City annals.

Pell is tied with Mike Zeigler (1964-67) for second place on Grove City's all-time touchdown pass list with 32.

Andrew DiDonato (2006-09) holds Grove City's career records for passing yards (7,509), completions (750), attempts (1,260), completion percentage (59.5) and touchdown passes (49).

Pell is on pace to become just the fourth quarterback to lead Grove City in passing in each of his four seasons, joining DiDonato, Steve Lacinski (1997-2000) and Greg Maxcy (1973-76).

ON TARGET

Grove City senior wide receiver Anthony Ritchie ranks fourth all-time at the College with 107 career receptions. He needs eight catches to pass Stephen Mercer (2005-08) for third place on the all-time list.

Ritchie ranks third in program history with 13 touchdown receptions. Rick Sems (1989-92) owns the career record with 17 touchdown catches and Dave DiDonato (2001-04) ranks second with 14.

Ritchie currently shares the team lead in receptions with 18. He led the team with 43 catches last year and 41 receptions in 2011. Ritchie is bidding to become just the fifth Wolverine player to lead the team in catches in three different seasons, joining Ed Houston (1962-64), Tom Karenbauer (1987-89), Jeff Mateer (1984-86) and Garret Schmidt (1996, 98-99).

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE

Grove City senior free safety Joe Diani leads the Wolverines with two interceptions this season. He led the squad with five interceptions in 2012 and shared the team lead in 2011 with three picks.

Diani would be just the third Grove City player to lead the team in interceptions in three different seasons. Current head coach Chris Smith led the team in interceptions in each of his four seasons from 1968 to 1971. Tony Colangelo led the Wolverines in interceptions in 1988, 1989 and 1990.

WE WANT MOORE

Grove City sophomore tailback Gabriel Moore returned a kickoff 56 yards September 28 at Bethany.

That is the longest runback by a Wolverine kickoff returner since October 16, 2004, when Ross Trimmer returned a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown at Washington & Jefferson. Trimmer set a new program record with that 93-yard kick return.

JIM CROSS MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Jim Cross Memorial Trophy is awarded to the outstanding player(s) in the annual Homecoming game. The trophy is given in memory of former Grove City athlete Jim Cross, who passed away in 1956.
