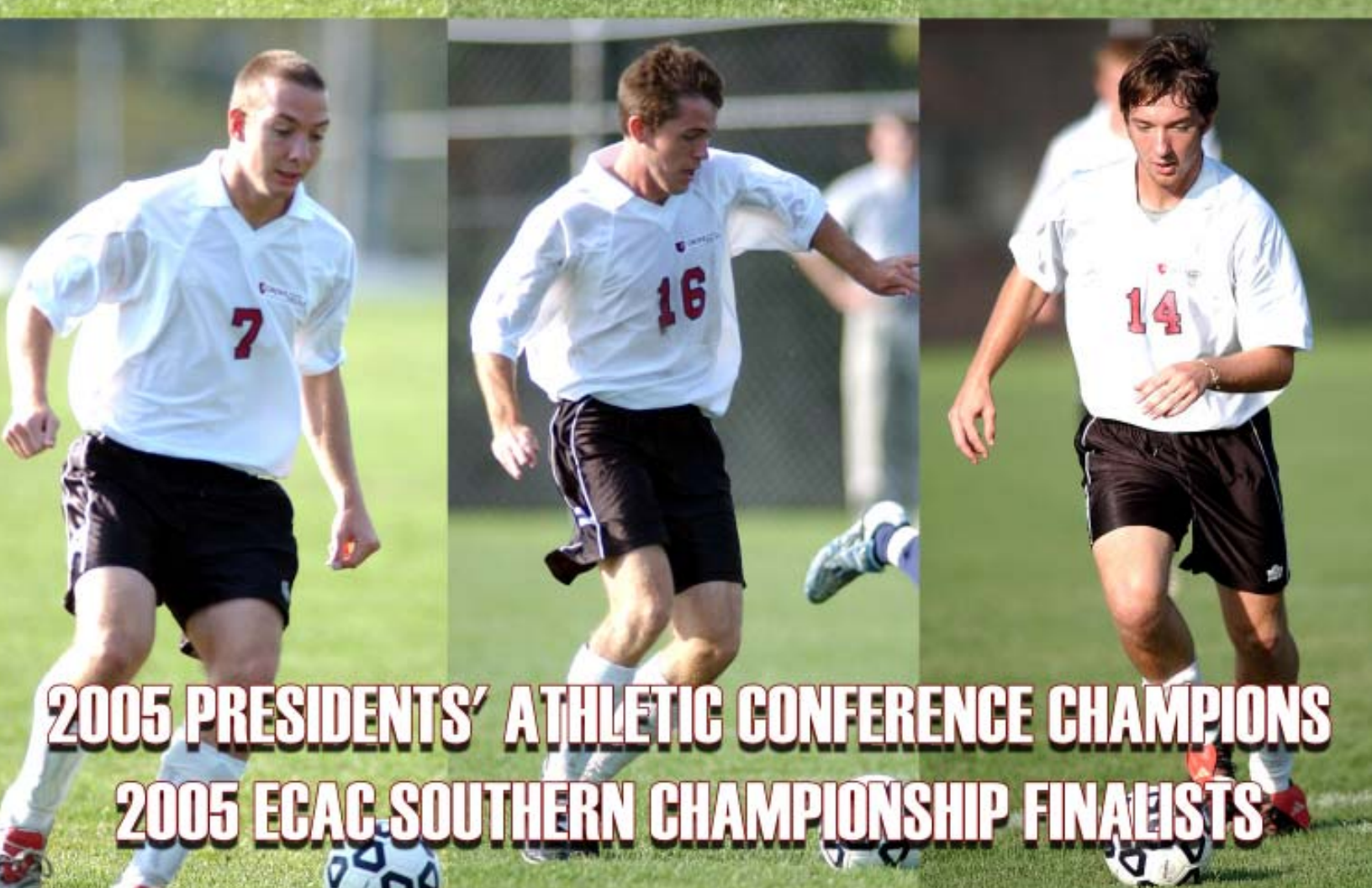

## HEAD COACH MICHAEL DREVES



Mike Dreves begins his first season as the sixth head men's soccer coach in Grove City College history.

A 1997 Grove City College graduate, Dreves had been an assistant coach for five seasons under retired head coach Dr. Don Lyle.

Dreves joined the Grove City athletic department on a full-time basis in June 2006 as an assistant professor of physical education and as Fitness Room Coordinator.

As an assistant coach, he helped Grove City post four winning seasons, an average of 11 wins per season and two postseason berths.

In 2005, Grove City captured its first-ever Presidents' Athletic Conference Championship Tournament title with a 2-1 victory over top-seeded Washington & Jefferson Nov. 5.

The Wolverines advanced to the Eastern College Athletic Conference Southern Championship Tournament finals and finished 2005 with a 13-6-5 record.

Dreves earned four letters as a player at Grove City from 1993-96. He was a two-year team captain and helped lead the Wolverines to the 1996 PAC and ECAC titles. The 1996 team earned the program's first PAC title and also posted a program-record 16 victories.

Dreves' coaching career began at the scholastic level. He guided the Titusville (Pa.) High School boys' soccer program from 1997-2000, directing the Rockets to 39 wins and one Tri-County Athletic Conference championship (1998) in four seasons.

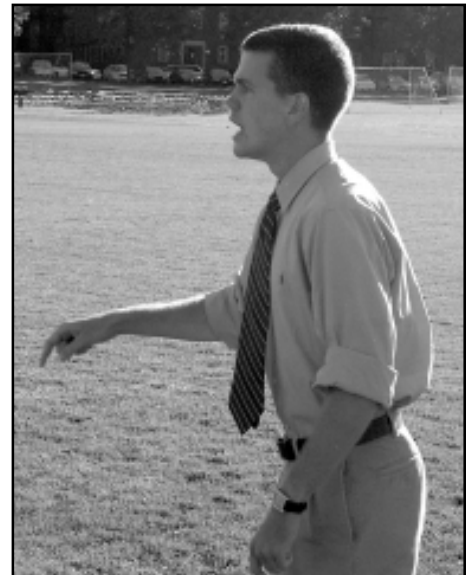
He then joined the Grove City coaching staff prior to the start of the 2001 season and helped the Wolverines reach the ECAC Tournament twice.

Dreves graduated from Grove City in May 1997 with a bachelor's degree in mathematics/secondary education.

He recently completed his master's degree in exercise science at nearby Slippery Rock University.

He taught mathematics at both Titusville (1997-2001) and Mercer (2001-06) High Schools before coming to Grove City full-time.

Dreves lives in Pine Township with his wife Sue (also a 1997 Grove City graduate) and their two sons, Joshua and Isaac.

# 2006 SEASON PREVIEW

The 2006 season will represent the start of a new era in the Grove City College men's soccer program as assistant coach Michael Dreves takes over as head coach.

But there are still more than just a few familiar faces on the Wolverine roster as Grove City prepares to defend its Presidents' Athletic Conference title.

Grove City returns eight starters and 14 lettermen from last year's squad that won the PAC and advanced to the finals of the Eastern College Athletic Conference Southern Championship Tournament.

Six seniors will lead the Wolverines this season. Five have started on a regular basis over the past three years and all six seniors have been significant contributors to Grove City's successes.

Senior forward Bob McNees is the returning PAC Player of the Year after leading the conference with 19 goals in 2005.

A three-year starter and two-time First Team All-PAC pick, McNees currently has 46 career goals. He needs three goals to become Grove City's all-time leading scorer.

Senior defenders Brendan McCommas and Stuart McCommas are three-year starters at outside back. The identical twin brothers have helped Grove City accumulate 27 shutouts over the past three seasons.

Seniors Jonathan Breese and Jonathan Mahtani are both returning starters at midfielder. Breese moved into

the starting lineup midway through his sophomore season and has helped Grove City to a 21-7-6 record in that span. He earned Second Team All-PAC in 2005.

Mahtani became a full-time starter at wing in 2005, appearing in 21 matches before being sidelined by a late-season injury.

Meanwhile, senior Ian Lamborn made 18 appearances as a reserve in 2005 and will contend for a starting post this season.

Grove City also returns five junior lettermen, including two full-time starters.

Junior goalkeeper Michael Manahan earned Second Team All-PAC in 2005 after limiting foes to a 0.83 goals-against average in his first year as a starter. Junior sweeper Tommy Bresson has started all 44 matches in his career and received PAC Honorable Mention last year.

Also back for the Wolverines are junior wings Chad Ashby and Eli Lamborn. Ashby started nine matches last year while Eli Lamborn made seven starts.

Junior forward Barry Snyder started 11 matches in 2005 and is a two-year letterman. He tied for third on the team with two assists last season.

Sophomores Jack Adams, Matt Sol and Robert Terhune all lettered last season as reserves and/or part-time starters. Adams and Terhune will challenge for starting spots at defender while Sol will look to secure a spot at midfield.

Several other veterans will be looking to break into the lineup this year, including juniors Dustin Heath, Nick Lassar and Dan Ragonesi.

The Wolverines open the 2006 season with eight consecutive home matches. Grove City opens the season against Pitt-Bradford Sept. 1. Presidents' Athletic Conference play will begin Sept. 9 against visiting Waynesburg.

# 2005 IN REVIEW

Since its 1938 inception, the Grove City College men's soccer team has become well-acquainted with success. In that time, Grove City teams have posted undefeated seasons, advanced to the national quarterfinals and toppled some of the nation's premier programs.

But the 2005 Wolverines accomplished something that no other Grove City team has achieved: an outright Presidents' Athletic Conference championship.

Grove City also advanced to the finals of the Eastern College Athletic Conference Southern Championship Tournament, finishing 2005 with a 13-6-5 record.

Junior forward Bob McNees earned the PAC's Most Valuable Player award while head coach Dr. Don Lyle concluded his 34-year stint at the helm by receiving the conference's Coach of the Year award.

Following a 2-1 season-opening loss against NAIA member Point Park Sept. 2, the Wolverines rebounded with a five-match unbeaten streak. Grove City picked up its first victory of 2005 Sept. 3 with a 2-1 win over Mount St. Joseph in the first-ever meeting between the programs.

Grove City then opened conference play Sept. 7 against visiting Bethany at College Field. Sophomore goalkeeper Michael Manahan stopped six Bison shots to earn his first collegiate shutout as the teams battled to a 0-0, double-overtime draw.

Three days later, the Wolverines rolled past new PAC member Thomas More, 3-0, at College Field in Lyle's 500th match as head coach. Senior midfielder Phil Bresson scored twice and also assisted on a McNees goal in the 63rd minute.

The Wolverines' shutout streak continued Sept. 13 at Pitt-Bradford as Grove City pulled out a 1-0 win. Jonathan Mahtani's unassisted goal late in the first half accounted for all of the scoring. Manahan stopped three shots to preserve the victory.

Grove City closed its five-match unbeaten streak Sept. 17 with a 3-1 home win over Waynesburg. McNees scored twice in the victory while Barry Snyder added a goal and an assist.

Grove City's shutout streak reached 430 minutes before Waynesburg scored midway through the second half. Still, the Wolverines improved to 2-0-1 in the PAC with the victory.

Consecutive setbacks at Penn State Behrend and Westminster briefly stopped Grove City's momentum. Yet, the Wolverines quickly recovered as summer faded into autumn.

Grove City went undefeated over its next six matches, including a 5-1 victory over Thiel Sept. 28. In that win, McNees recorded a career-high nine points with four goals and an assist. Senior Nate Jones added a goal and two assists in the win.

Following a hard-fought, 1-1 draw against long-time rival Geneva at College Field Sept. 30, Grove City extended its undefeated stretch Oct. 4 with a 3-0 home

win over Westminster. McNees registered his second hat trick in a week as Bresson, Snyder and junior Stuart McCommas all supplied assists.

Meanwhile, the defense – anchored by stopper Adam Ludwig, sweeper Tommy Bresson and Manahan – posted the team's fourth shutout of the season.

Four days later, Grove City made its first trip to Thomas More and secured a 1-0 win over the host Saints. Jones assisted McNees in the 63rd minute to account for the match's lone goal.

Both the unbeaten and shutout streaks continued Oct. 11 as Grove City battled host La Roche to a 0-0 deadlock in Pittsburgh.

Grove City then knocked Washington & Jefferson from the ranks of the unbeaten in the PAC Oct. 15 as the Wolverines earned a 2-0 victory over W&J before a capacity crowd at College Field. Jones scored the game-winner at 50:24 after an assist from freshman Matt Sol.

A 2-0 loss at Carnegie Mellon Oct. 19 stopped the six-match unbeaten streak. Grove City then appeared to be on its way to another 0-0 draw with Bethany three days later.

However, Stuart McCommas scored with two minutes left in the second overtime to give Grove City a 1-0 win over the host Bison. Brendan McCommas provided the assist for his twin brother.

Grove City's five-match road swing continued Oct. 24 with a 0-0 draw at Thiel. Manahan preserved the Wolverines' ninth shutout of the season with three saves.

The Wolverines wrapped up the second seed in the season-ending PAC Championship Tournament by splitting their final two regular season matches. Grove City topped host Waynesburg, 1-0, Oct. 26. Grove City then bowed to Washington & Jefferson, 2-0, in the PAC finale in Washington.

Grove City hosted No. 3 seed Bethany in the PAC Tournament semifinals at College Field Nov. 2. Again, the Wolverines used late heroics to slip past the Bison. In the 88th minute, McNees headed in a cross from Eli Lamborn to break a scoreless tie and send Grove City into the conference finals.

Three days later, the Wolverines invaded Washington & Jefferson's Alexandre Stadium and emerged with a 2-1 victory over the top-seeded Presidents in the PAC Championship Tournament finals. The victory gave Grove City its first-ever outright PAC title.

Grove City advanced to the ECAC Tournament as the fourth seed in the eight-team bracket. The Wolverines hosted the first-ever postseason game at College Field Nov. 9 against No. 5 seed Lake Erie in the quarterfinal round. Lamborn scored his first two collegiate goals as the Wolverines advanced to the semifinals with a 2-1 win. Junior Jonathan Breese and McNees each assisted Lamborn.

Grove City went to overtime for the sixth time during 2005 in its ECAC semifinal against top-seeded McDaniel Nov. 12. And again, Grove City remained undefeated in overtime by winning a shootout, 2-1.

Breese and Jones each scored in the shootout while Manahan stuffed McDaniel's Thomas Kane in the final round to secure the victory. Grove City trailed 1-0 in the second half before McNees tied the match at 61:14 after receiving a cross from sophomore wing Chad Ashby.

Grove City's bid for the ECAC title ended the following afternoon, however, as host Johns Hopkins earned a 3-0 victory over the Wolverines in the championship match.

In addition to the the postseason honors earned by Lyle and McNees, Ludwig earned First Team All-PAC while Breese, Jones and Manahan achieved Second Team honors.

# THE PRESIDENTS' ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Founded in 1955, the Presidents' Athletic Conference continues its mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence.

Comprised of 10 select private colleges - Bethany College, Chatham College, Geneva College, Grove City College, Saint Vincent College, Thiel College, Thomas More College, Washington and Jefferson College, Waynesburg College and Westminster College - the PAC remains a unique organization in this day of high pressure intercollegiate athletics.

Geneva and Saint Vincent are currently in the process of becoming full NCAA Division III members. Saint Vincent will play a full PAC schedule in all sports during the 2006-07 year while Geneva and Chatham will begin playing complete PAC schedules in 2007-08.

With academics at the center of each member's philosophy, the PAC is built on the principle that an athletic program is a part of college life, but not an entity in itself. The PAC annually crowns champions in 19 sports. All-Conference status is awarded in all 19 sports.

Head coaches select all-league squads for all team sports, while in individual sports such as cross country and tennis, all-PAC accolades are based upon performances at the conference championships.

The PAC annually awards its men's and women's All-Sports Trophies to the schools which perform best across the board in conference competition.

Washington & Jefferson won both the men's and women's All-Sports Trophies during the 2005-06 academic year.

True to its mission, the PAC has produced numerous CoSIDA Academic All-Americans as well as NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship winners. Grove City led all PAC schools with three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans during the 2005-2006 year.

In 2005-2006, the league named 428 student-athletes to the PAC Academic Honor Roll, which recognizes all participating student-athletes who attain a term grade-point average of 3.60 or above. Grove City led all conference schools with 84 total selections.

# ABOUT GROVE CITY COLLEGE

The beautifully landscaped campus of Grove City College stretches over 150 acres and includes 27 neo-Gothic buildings. It is considered one of the loveliest in the nation.

While the College has changed to meet the needs of the society it serves, its basic philosophy has remained unchanged since its founding in 1876. It is a Christian, liberal arts institution, dedicated to the principle of providing the highest quality education at the lowest possible cost.

Wishing to remain truly independent and to retain its distinctive qualities as a private school governed by private citizens (trustees), it is one of few colleges in the country that does not accept federal funds.

Affiliated with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), but not narrowly denominational, the College believes that to be well-educated a student should be exposed to the central ideas of the Judeo-Christian tradition.

Grove City College offers undergraduate degrees in liberal arts, sciences, engineering, business, and music and is distinguished as a national leader in education.

Grove City's programs in electrical and mechanical engineering are accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission Board of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology.

The "big business school curriculum" prepares students for today's global business reality. An extensive variety of internship opportunities are provided across the curriculum.

Grove City College wants its students to be prepared in this age of mobile information technology.

Each entering freshman receives a color notebook computer which is his or hers to keep upon graduation with a four-year degree.

The College believes that its student body has a unique mix of talents and abilities. Its Career Services program helps students identify those key assets during the first year and then builds a four-year strategy to help them pursue a satisfying career.

Personal counseling, professional speakers, databases, alumni contacts, summer internships, corporate visits, employer presentations and more are incorporated into the career preparation experience. Grove City follows the semester calendar plan, in addition to offering two-week intersessions in January and May.

Most of the 2,400 students live in separate men's and women's dormitories. The rest are local commuters or married students. A full program of cultural, professional, athletic and social activities is offered, including 19 intercollegiate varsity athletic teams.

Grove City, a town of 8,100 people, is located 60 miles north of Pittsburgh. It is located near Interstates 79 and 80 and has a municipal airport.

# FACILITIES

All 19 of Grove City College's intercollegiate varsity athletic teams utilize the College's superior facilities for competition, practices and off-season training and conditioning.

Grove City's athletic facilities have undergone numerous renovations and improvements in recent years, with more upgrades scheduled in the immediate future.

On lower campus, Robert E. Thorn Field is home to the College's football and track and field teams. During the summer of 2006, the College installed CSTurf at Robert E. Thorn Field. CSTurf is a synthetic playing surface that features polyethylene LSR grass fibers and a rubber infill system.

Lights were also added at Robert E. Thorn Field while the 8-lane track around the field was resurfaced.

These upgrades benefit the entire campus community as the complex will now be used by both the College's club sports teams and its intramural program, along with the varsity teams.

The track is also available for use by recreational walkers and joggers. The complex also features 10 all-weather tennis courts next to the stadium.

Phillips Field House, located at the north end of the complex, features several locker rooms, an athletic training room, meeting rooms and coaches' offices.

It is used by the football, track and tennis programs throughout the academic year. Several upgrades to the facility were recently made.

The Physical Learning Center (PLC) houses the Grove City College Arena, home to the College's basketball and volleyball programs.

The 1,800-seat Arena received new scoreboards, new scorer's tables and new shotclocks during the 2004-05 academic year.

In addition, the PLC features the Grove City College Pool, one of the premier aquatic facilities in the region.

Each year, Grove City hosts the Presidents' Athletic Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the state-of-the-art facility.

The PLC also features a second pool, the Recreational Pool, which is used by members of the College community year-round.

A fitness room featuring aerobic, Cybex and free weight equipment is an integral part of the PLC. Expansion of the fitness room is a keystone of the Center's ongoing renovations.

The PLC also features six racquetball/handball courts as well as two adjacent intramural rooms. The intramural rooms each feature four basketball courts, four indoor tennis courts, four volleyball courts, an indoor track and two indoor jumping pits.

The building houses an athletic training room, locker rooms and offices for coaches and physical education faculty. In 2004, the College constructed a new office suite for coaches and athletic administration.

Grove City's outdoor athletic facilities have also received numerous upgrades. The varsity soccer field, College Field, was expanded and re-sodded during the summer of 2005.
