

THE GROVE CITY COLLEGE POOL



The Grove City College Competitive Pool is one of the nation's top small-college aquatic facilities. The 8-lane facility is regarded as one of the fastest pools in the region and is reserved solely for use by the College's swimming and diving and water polo athletes.

The Grove City College Pool features two one-meter diving boards and one three-meter board as well as five Power Rack stations. An eight-lane electronic Colorado Timing System is integrated into the pool and scoreboard. The scoreboard features eight lines for results, three lines for event/heat and scoring and a scrolling line that shows lane-by-lane results.

The shallow end of the Pool is seven feet; thus the Grove City College Pool is able to host several Collegiate Water Polo Association events that are restricted from "shallow-deep" pools. Since 2000, Grove City College has hosted several CWPA championship events.

The Grove City College Pool is 25 yards in length and 56 feet wide. It holds 408,913 gallons of water. The seating capacity of the Pool area is approximately 400.

The Pool has been home to the Presidents' Athletic Conference Swimming and Diving Championships since 1990.

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HEAD COACH DAVE FRITZ



A 1994 Grove City College graduate, Dave Fritz is in his eighth season as Grove City College's head men's swimming and diving coach. Under his direction, Grove City has returned to the national spotlight as one of the nation's premier small-college programs.

In 2006-07, two Grove City swimmers earned NCAA Division III championships as Tim Whitbeck won the national title in the 50 free and Caleb Courage repeated as national champion in the 100 free.

Last season, 11 Grove City swimmers earned NCAA Division III All-America distinction as the Wolverines placed sixth in the team standings at the NCAA Championships. During the regular season, Grove City went 12-2 overall and won the Presidents' Athletic Conference title for the second straight season.

Fourteen Grove City swimmers have earned NCAA All-America honors during his tenure as head coach. In 2006, Courage became Grove City's first men's swimmer to earn a national title.

Fritz has guided Grove City to a 65-18 overall dual-meet record, including a College-record 15 victories during the 2006-07 season. In 2006-07, Grove City posted victories over eventual NCAA Division III champion Kenyon, perennial power Case Western Reserve, NCAA Division I institution Butler and archrival Westminster.

In his second season as head coach, 2003-04, Fritz led Grove City to the PAC championship, along with a 6-3 dual-meet record. He has helped Grove City extend its streak of consecutive winning seasons to 58.

Fritz is a member of the American Swim Coaches Association (ASCA) and has served as a collegiate and scholastic water polo official. He has been awarded the ASCA's Certificate of Excellence five times. He has also earned Level Four certification from the ASCA.

The 2009-10 season is also Fritz's first as Grove City's head women's swimming and diving coach.

Fritz spent eight seasons as head coach of Grove City's women's water polo squad. In the spring of 2002, Fritz directed the women's team to a 7-11 mark after taking over on an interim basis. In 2007, Fritz led the women's water polo team to a program-record 18 victories and a fifth-place finish at the Collegiate III National Championships.

In 2008, Fritz guided Grove City to a fifth-place finish at the Collegiate III Championships in New London, Conn. as the Wolverines finished 13-12 overall. Six Grove City water polo players earned All-America honors under his guidance.

He owns master's degrees from both Duquesne University and Slippery Rock University. Fritz lives in Slippery Rock with his wife Tammy, daughters Emily and Mary, and sons Hayden and Harrison.

DIVING COACH TAMMY FRITZ



Tammy Fritz is in her seventh season as the diving coach at Grove City College. Grove City's diving corps has become one of the region's elite under Fritz's guidance.

In 2007, Fritz helped junior Joe Riddell provisionally qualify for the NCAA Division III Championships. Riddell and Kyle Grubbs placed 1-2 in the PAC Championships in 2007-08.

Prior to joining the Grove City staff, Fritz worked as the diving coach at Chartiers Valley High School in Bridgeville, Pa. for two seasons. Fritz also has 14 years of experience coaching gymnastics at various age levels. She has guided numerous athletes to state championships.

Fritz is in her seventh year as an English teacher at Grove City High School. She also taught English for eight years at Chartiers Valley. Fritz graduated from Washington and Jefferson in 1992. In July 2002, she completed her master's degree in education from

Duquesne University.

She lives in nearby Slippery Rock with her husband, Dave, daughters Emily and Mary, and sons Hayden and Harrison.

Assistant Coach Jon Miller



Jonathan Miller is in his first season as an assistant coach for men's and women's swimming and diving at Grove City College.

A native of Fresno, Calif., Miller came to Grove City after spending the 2008-09 season at California Baptist University. He worked as an assistant men's and women's water polo coach at California Baptist while completing his master of science degree in kinesiology.

Miller earned four letters as a goalkeeper for California Baptist's men's water polo team from 2004 to 2007. He graduated as the school's all-time leader with 1,025 saves. Miller also set the program's single-match record for saves with 22.

He graduated from CBU in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.

Miller will begin his first season as Grove City's women's water polo caoch this spring. He is also an assistant professor of physical education and exercise science at Grove City.

Miller lives in Grove City.

Assistant Coach Amanda Brozenic



Amanda Brozenic is in her fourth season as an assistant swimming and diving coach at Grove City. Brozenic joined the coaching staff prior to the start of the 2006-07 season after graduating from Grove City in May 2006.

In 2009, she helped guide Grove City's women's team to its first Presidents' Athletic Conference title since 1999.

A native of Slippery Rock, Brozenic earned four letters as a member of the College's swimming and diving team from 2002-06.

Brozenic helped Grove City to three winning seasons during her career as a breaststroker. She also competed in the individual medley. As a senior, Brozenic placed third in the Presidents' Athletic Conference in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke.

She earned a bachelor of science degree in mathematics/secondary education at Grove City. She is in her fourth year as a mathematics teacher at Sharon High School.

SEASON PREVIEW

Few college swimming and diving programs can watch two national champions and two other multiple-time NCAA All-Americans walk across the stage at graduation without lowering the team's expectations for the following the season.

The Grove City College men's swimming and diving team is one of those programs.

Grove City enters the 2009-10 season with numerous standouts back in the fold, including seven returning NCAA All-Americans.

Those seven All-Americans will join a seven-man senior class in leading the Wolverines this year.

Grove City features depth and experience in nearly every event this year as the Wolverines pursue their third consecutive Presidents' Athletic Conference championship.

The Wolverines are also aiming to send another large contingent of athletes to the NCAA Championships once again in 2010.

Grove City's senior class features three, three-year lettermen in Rich Albertson, Kyle Grubbs and Lincoln Larsen. Albertson will be one of Grove City's top entries in the backstroke and butterfly while Larsen is one of the fastest breaststrokers in school history.

Grubbs will lead an experienced platoon of divers in 2009-10. He could challenge for an invitation to the NCAA Championships this year.

Four other senior lettermen return this winter for Grove City. Andrew Ashleigh is a two-year letterman and will likely contribute in the breaststroke and freestyle events.

Distance specialist Matt Green returns for his fourth season after earning two letters while classmate Tucker Gregg will look to build on his strong sophomore season. Gregg missed last year due to an injury.

Co-captain Seth Zimmerman, another two-year letterwinner, will help lead a relatively young sprint squad for the Wolverines.

Grove City's nine-man junior class includes a trio of returning NCAA All-Americans in Cam Coppelli, Bennett Keefer and Nate Nielsen.

Coppelli is expected to be one of the Wolverines' top backstrokers this year while Keefer will bolster Grove City in the breaststroke and individual medley events.

Nielsen emerged as a standout in the distance events last year and will likely be one of Grove City's top entries in the longer events.

Another distance specialist, Jared Bailey, is back after earning letters in each of his first two seasons. Butterflier Chris Marasco returns for his third season after lettering as a freshman and a sophomore. Both are expected to be significant contributors.

Juniors Matt Armstrong, Dan Gummel, Andrew Parry and Dan Wells all lettered as sophomores and will each look to break into the lineup on a full-time basis.



Sophomore Ben Bowser set five school records as a freshman in 2008-09. He is one of Grove City's most versatile competitors.

Armstrong and Gummel will both compete in the butterfly while Parry and Wells are both backstrokers.

The sophomore class is dotted with returning All-Americans and national qualifiers along with several other athletes who made great strides as rookies.

Clay Beckner, Ben Bowser, Kirk Gagliardo and Nick Hamilton all return after achieving All-America status as freshmen. Beckner will be one of Grove City's top breaststrokers while the versatile Bowser will be used in a number of events. He owns the school record in both individual medley races.

Gagliardo and Hamilton are both expected to be significant contributors in the freestyle events. Gagliardo is one of the top returning sprinters in the region while Hamilton will be a factor in the longer distances.

Sophomore Josh Kim provisionally qualified for the NCAA Championships in the 1650 as a freshman and returns as one of Grove City's top distance entries.

Diver Joe Rzempoluch returns after a strong freshman season and will join Grubbs in giving Grove City a strong 1-2 combination on the diving squad.

Sophomores Chris Downing and Matt Mahan return in the breaststroke while Collin Foster bolsters Grove City in the backstroke. Also back is sophomore butterfly performer Seth Shaheen.

A large freshman class will also be expected to contribute as the Wolverines look to defend their conference title and capture their 59th straight winning season.

2008-09 SEASON REVIEW

The 2008-09 season proved to be one of the finest in the proud history of the Grove City College men's swimming and diving program as the Wolverines capped the campaign by finishing sixth nationally at the NCAA Division III Championships.

Eleven Grove City performers achieved NCAA All-America honors and senior Caleb Courage punctuated his collegiate career by winning his third national title in the 100 freestyle.

Grove City also repeated as Presidents' Athletic Conference champion and finished with a 12-2 dualmeet record. The 12 wins clinched the Wolverines' 58th consecutive winning season.

Grove City opened the season by winning the Clarion University Fall Classic October 24-25. Clay Beckner, Cam Coppelli, Courage and Peter Larsen won the 400 medley relay to help vault the Wolverines to the team title.

Freshmen Ben Bowser (200 fly), Kirk Gagliardo (500) and Josh Kim (1650) all earned victories in their debut as collegians.

Grove City opened the dual-meet portion of the schedule November 1 against longtime rival Carnegie Mellon.

Courage swept the sprints while Tim Whitbeck set a new CMU pool record in the 50 with a relay-opening time of 20.86 seconds. However, CMU pulled out a 174-125 win.

Grove City evened its record at 1-1 November 15 with a 152-114 win over Hiram in the Wolverines' home opener. Nate Nielsen won both the 200 free and 200 backstroke while Bennett Keefer won the 200 breast.

Six days later, the Wolverines notched a 160-108 win over visiting Saint Vincent as Jared Bailey and Lincoln Larsen both tallied two wins. Bailey won the 100 and 200 free while Larsen won the 500 free and 100 breaststroke.

Grove City raised its record to 5-1 November 22 by sweeping a quadrangular meet at Case Western Reserve. The Wolverines earned wins over Case, Washington & Jefferson and Kenyon to extend their win streak to five.

Courage won the 100 and 200 free and also set a new school record in winning the 200 IM. Kyle Grubbs won 3-meter diving while Peter Larsen touched first in the 50 fly.

Grove City wrapped up the month with a 152-127 pasting of Allegheny November 25. The Wolverines finished 1-2 in each event and exhibitioned the final six races

Grubbs swept the diving events while Drew Snyder won the 100 free. Rich Albertson claimed the 200 butterfly while Nielsen helped cement the victory by taking first in the 1000.

The Wolverines returned from Thanksgiving break to host the annual Longnecker Invitational December 4-5.



Tim Whitbeck capped his career at Grove City as a 14-time NCAA All-American.

Grove City accumulated a meet-record 1,601 points at the two-day event to earn the team title. The Wolverines swept all five relays.

The relay sweep included a school-record effort in the 200 free relay as Courage, Gagliardo, Snyder and Whitbeck posted a time of 1:21.98. Grove City also swept the top five positions in the 50 free.

Grove City punctuated 2008 with 69-46 win over PAC foe Bethany December 10. Kim won both the 100 butterfly and the 100 breaststroke to help lead the Wolverine effort. Nick Hamilton won the 1650 while sophomore Dan Wells won the 50 free.

The Wolverines opened the second semester in the same manner they closed the first semester: with a win. Grove City clinched its 58th straight winning season January 17 with a 156-137 win at Washington & Jefferson.

Courage took first in the 50 and 100 free while Lincoln Larsen swept the breaststroke events.

The Wolverines' eight-meet win streak came to an end January 24 with a 162-120 setback against perennial powerhouse Denison.

Whitbeck (50 free) and Courage (100 free) both provisionally qualified for the NCAA Championships with wins. Courage also qualified for the NCAA meet in the 200 free with his performance.

The Wolverines closed the regular season on a fourmeet win streak. Westminster became the first team to fall during the Wolverines' late-season charge as Grove City recorded a 141-121 win over the Titans.

Courage swept the backstroke and also won the 200 individual medley for Grove City. Whitbeck took both the 50 and 100 free and then anchored the Wolverines' winning 200 free relay squad.

Grove City reached double-digits in wins for the 17th time in program history January 31 as the Wolverines swept Penn State Behrend and Pitt-Bradford in a double dual.

Whitbeck, Collin Foster, Matt Mahan and Nate Brunk opened the meet by winning the 200 medley relay. Their effort helped lift Grove City to an 11-2 record.

Grove City concluded the dual-meet portion of the schedule January 31 with a 156-114 win at Wooster in non-conference action.

2008-09 SEASON REVIEW

The Wolverines won all five freestyle events and also received wins from Bowser (400 IM) and Grubbs (3-meter diving).

The Wolverines wrapped up the regular season by successfully defending their Presidents' Athletic Conference title at the Grove City Invitational/PAC Championships February 12-14.

Grove City amassed 949 team points in the three-day event to win its 22nd overall conference title. Head coach Dave Fritz earned the conference's Coach of the Year award while Courage won both the conference's Most Valuable Performer honor and the Invitational's High Point Award.

Grove City athletes won 13 events during the Championships, including four of the five relays. Courage won the 50, 100 and 100 backstroke while Bowser swept the individual medleys. Grubbs won both diving events.

Fourteen Grove City athletes earned All-PAC honors in voting by the league coaches following the season. Bowser, Coppelli, Courage, Gagliardo, Grubbs, Bennett Keefer, Peter Larsen, Kim and Whitbeck all earned First Team All-PAC.

Beckner, Hamilton, Lincoln Larsen, Nielsen and Snyder landed on the Second Team.

Eleven Grove City athletes advanced to the NCAA Division III Championships in Minneapolis March 18-21. All 11 earned NCAA All-America honors.

Courage set a new national record in winning the 100 freestyle with a time of 43.60 seconds. He also won national titles in 2006 and 2007.

Courage finished second in the 50 while Whitbeck took third in that event. Whitbeck also posted a 15th-place finish in the 100 free.

Grove City also scored points in all five relays. Courage, Gagliardo, Peter Larsen and Whitbeck placed third in the 400 free relay while Courage, Gagliardo, Snyder and Whitbeck finished third in the 200 free relay.

Bowser, Courage, Keefer and Whitbeck earned eighth place in the 400 medley relay while the Beckner-Coppelli-Larsen-Whitbeck quartet finished 12th in the 200 medley relay.

Courage, Gagliardo, Hamilton and Nielsen placed 12th in the 800 free relay.

Grove City finished the Championships with 168 team points. The sixth-place finish is the highest in program history.

PROGRAM HISTORY

Few swimming and diving programs can match the tradition of excellence that has developed at Grove City College since the program's 1937 inception.

With 58 all-time NCAA All-Americans, five national champions, 507 victories and 58 straight winning seasons, one can see that success is a way of life at Grove City.

Yet, numbers alone do not tell the story of the Grove City men's swimming and diving program. The program has grown from humble beginnings into one of the nation's finest over the past 70-plus years.

Intercollegiate swimming and diving at Grove City College began during the 1937-38 academic year. During the program's first five seasons, Grove City managed just eight total wins. World War II interrupted the program for four seasons but Grove City continued to gain traction.

In 1950, the Wolverines went 5-6. Two years later, head coach Jim Loveless led Grove City to its first winning season with a 6-4 mark. That season began Grove City's current run of 58 straight winning seasons.

Loveless coached the team until 1954, when Russ Weider took over. In his one season as head coach, Weider led Grove City to a 9-1 record and the school's first Penn-Ohio championship.

Philip Sedgley coached the team to an 18-2 mark and two Penn-Ohio runner-up finishes from 1955-57. Following that season, Grove City hired a coach who would make an immeasurable impact on the swimming and diving program: Jim Longnecker.


In Longnecker's first year as head coach, 1957-58, the Wolverines went 6-5. That season, the program produced the first of its 51 all-time All-Americans as Ubbo van der Valk produced the eighth-fastest time in the nation in the 100-yard breaststroke.

By 1962, Grove City emerged as the region's preeminent program as the Wolverines went 12-0 and won the Penn-Ohio meet.

That season began a run of seven straight league titles for Grove City.

In 1964, Grove City hosted the first-ever NCAA College Division Swimming and Diving Championships. Grove City placed ninth in that inaugural meet.

Unfortunately, it would be the last time Grove City participated in the national championships for some time. Following that year, the College banned its teams from participating in postseason competition.

Despite a 33-9 dual-meet record and four Penn-Ohio titles over the next four years, Grove City did not compete in the national meet, preventing several standouts from earning NCAA All-America honors.

Grove City returned to the NCAA Championships in 1969, finishing 36th nationally.

In 1975, after a 12-1 dual-meet record, Grove City took 13th at the inaugural Division III Championships. It was the first of five top-20 national finishes for Grove City in the 1970s.

Six years later, Grove City produced its first national champion as diver Chris Van De Mark swept both the 1- and 3-meter diving titles at the 1981 NCAA meet.

In 1982, Van De Mark successfully defended his 1-meter title and earned runner-up in 3-meter diving after helping the team to a 12-0 dual-meet mark.

The next year, Dan Young won the NCAA 1-meter diving title and in 1984, Clark Johnson captured the 3-meter diving national title.

PROGRAM HISTORY

Grove City began competition in the Presidents' Athletic Conference in 1984-85 and quickly emerged as the league's dominant program by winning eight of 11 PAC titles.

The Wolverines went 10-0 in 1986-87, then assembled 40 straight victories from 1993-96. Grove City went undefeated in 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96.

In Longnecker's final season, 1996-97, Grove City went 10-2.

Longnecker retired after 40 seasons with 366 wins, 44 All-Americans and 15 league titles to his credit. Following the 1997 season, 1983 Grove City grad Keith Bullion took over as head coach.



Diver Chris Van De Mark won two national titles in 1981 and won the 1-meter NCAA title in 1982.

During Bullion's five years as head coach, Grove City won three league titles and went 33-17 overall.

A new era began in 2002 as 1994 alum Dave Fritz replaced Bullion as head coach.

In 2006, Caleb Courage became Grove City's first men's swimming national champion as he won the NCAA title in the 100 free. In 2007, Courage defended his national title while teammate Tim Whitbeck won the NCAA title in the 50 free.

Grove City returned to the top of the conference in 2008 as the Wolverines won their first PAC title since 2004.

In 2009, Grove City repeated as conference champion and finished with a 12-2 dual-meet record. Eleven Wolverine swimmers earned NCAA All-America honors in helping Grove City finish sixth at the NCAA meet.

Courage earned his third national title and set a new national mark in the 100 free with a time of 43.60.



Caleb Courage won three national titles in the 100 freestyle and earned 18 career All-America honors.

SWIMMING & DIVING HALL OF FAME

Grove City College initiated its Swimming and Diving Hall of Fame in 1985 as a means of honoring those athletes who have displayed a level of excellence worthy of such recognition. These individuals have shown commitment to the program and were identified by their teammates and predecessors as exemplary athletes and sportsmen. Eleven classes have been inducted into the Hall of Fame over the past quarter-century.

ABOUT THE PAC

Founded in 1955, the Presidents' Athletic Conference continues its mission of promoting intercollegiate athletics and the pursuit of academic excellence.

Comprised of 10 select private colleges - Bethany College, Chatham University, Geneva College, Grove City College, Saint Vincent College, Thiel College, Thomas More College, Washington & Jefferson College, Waynesburg University and Westminster College - the PAC remains a unique organization in this day of highpressure intercollegiate athletics.

With academics at the center of each member's philosophy, the PAC is built on the principle that an athletic program is a part of college life, but not an entity in itself.

During the 2005-06 academic year, Chatham College, Geneva College and Saint Vincent College all joined the PAC. Chatham competed for PAC championships for the first time during the 2007-08 academic year. Geneva and Saint Vincent are playing full conference schedules during their time as provisional members of NCAA Division III.

The PAC annually crowns champions in 19 sports. All-Conference status is awarded in all 19 sports. Head coaches select all-league squads for all team sports, while in individual sports such as cross country and tennis, all-PAC accolades are based upon performances at the conference championships.

The PAC annually awards its men's and women's All-Sports Trophies to the schools which perform best across the board in conference competition. Washington & Jefferson won the Men's All-Sports Trophy in 2008-09 while Westminster won the Women's All-Sports Trophy.

In 2008-09, the league named 604 student-athletes to the PAC Academic Honor Roll, which recognizes all participating student-athletes who attain a term gradepoint average of 3.60 or above.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The beautifully landscaped campus of Grove City College stretches over 150 acres and includes 27 neo-Gothic buildings. It is considered one of the loveliest in the nation.

While the College has changed to meet the needs of the society it serves, its basic philosophy has remained unchanged since its founding in 1876. It is a Christian, liberal arts institution, dedicated to the principle of providing the highest quality education at the lowest possible cost.

Wishing to remain truly independent and to retain its distinctive qualities as a private school governed by private citizens (trustees), it is one of few colleges in the country that does not accept federal funds.

Affiliated with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), but not narrowly denominational, the College believes that to be well-educated a student should be exposed to the central ideas of the Judeo-Christian tradition.

Grove City College offers undergraduate degrees in liberal arts, sciences, engineering, business, and music and is distinguished as a national leader in education.

Grove City's programs in electrical and mechanical engineering are accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission Board of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology.

The "big business school curriculum" prepares students for today's global business reality. An extensive variety of internship opportunities are provided across the curriculum.

Grove City College wants its students to be prepared in this age of mobile information technology. Each entering freshman receives a notebook computer which is his or hers to keep upon graduation with a four-year degree.

Grove City follows the semester calendar plan, in addition to offering two-week sessions in January and May.

Most of the 2,500 students live in separate men's and women's dormitories. The rest are local commuters or married students. A full program of cultural, professional, athletic and social activities is offered, including 19 intercollegiate varsity athletic teams.

Grove City, a town of 8,100 people, is located 60 miles north of Pittsburgh. It is located near Interstates 79 and 80 and has a municipal airport.

ATHLETIC FACILITIES

All 19 of Grove City College's intercollegiate varsity athletic teams utilize the College's superior facilities for competition, practices and off-season training and conditioning.

Grove City's athletic facilities have undergone numerous renovations and improvements in recent years, with more upgrades scheduled in the immediate future.

On lower campus, Robert E. Thorn Field is home to the College's football and track and field teams. During the summer of 2006, the College installed CSTurf at Robert E. Thorn Field. CSTurf is a synthetic playing surface that features polyethylene LSR grass fibers and a rubber infill system.

Lights were also added at Robert E. Thorn Field while the 8-lane track around the field was resurfaced.

These upgrades benefit the entire campus community as the complex will now be used by both the College's club sports teams and its intramural program, along with the varsity teams.

The track is also available for use by recreational walkers and joggers. The complex also features 10 all-weather tennis courts next to the stadium.

Phillips Field House, located at the north end of the complex, features several locker rooms, an athletic training room, meeting rooms and coaches' offices. It is used by the football, track and tennis programs throughout the academic year. Several upgrades to the facility were recently made.

The Physical Learning Center (PLC) houses the Grove City College Arena, home to the College's basketball and volleyball programs.

The 1,800-seat Arena recently received new scoreboards, new scorer's tables and new shotclocks.



The Grove City College Pool is one of the nation's premier small-college venues for both swimming and diving and water polo.



Grove City College installed CSTurf, lights and new track and field competition areas at Robert E. Thorn Field in summer 2006.

In addition, the PLC features the Grove City College Pool, one of the premier aquatic facilities in the region. Each year, Grove City hosts the Presidents' Athletic Conference Swimming and Diving Championships at the state-of-theart facility.

In 2008, the College also hosted the Collegiate Water Polo Association Western Division Championships at the College Pool.

The PLC also features a second pool, the Recreational Pool, which is used by members of the College community year-round.

A fitness room featuring aerobic, Cybex and free weight equipment is an integral part of the PLC. Expansion of the fitness room is a keystone of the Center's ongoing renovations.

The PLC also features six racquetball/hand-ball courts as well as two adjacent intramural rooms. The intramural rooms each feature four basketball courts, four indoor tennis courts, four volleyball courts, an indoor track and two indoor jumping pits.

New synthetic floors were installed in the intramural rooms in summer 2006.

The building houses an athletic training room, locker rooms and offices for coaches and physical education faculty. In 2004, the College constructed a new office suite for coaches and athletic administration.

Grove City's outdoor athletic facilities have also received numerous upgrades in recent years.

The varsity soccer field, College Field, was expanded and re-sodded during the summer of 2005. College Field also received a new press box during the summer of 2007.

Meanwhile, Grove City's baseball and softball facilities received major facelifts in 2007-08 as new dugouts, new fencing and electronic scoreboards were installed on both fields.
